- First, we do not collect or store immigration/citizenship information for our students and families.
- Second, we are legally prevented from sharing student and family information without your permission or a verified court order.
- Finally, should a federal agency visit campus or contact Academy leadership or faculty, our team has direction to immediately contact our Superintendent's office for support.

As it pertains to other future possible changes, we will monitor those closely, pursue appropriate guidance, and communicate with and support you. Thank you for entrusting us to care for your children. Please reach out if you have any questions.

SPIRIT WEEK

General Guidelines for All Days:

Students must be in Spirit Week attire or the school uniform each day. Clothing needs to cover at least the same areas as the school polo or oxford (just above the elbow) and the shorts/skirts (just above the knee) and contain no rips or openings. Clothing must be without logos, words, or pop culture references (except where noted).

Monday 2/10/25 Pajama Day

Students are permitted to wear tasteful and appropriate pajamas. Long pants, sweat pants, slippers and/or Crocs permitted. Any student not adhering to the rules of appropriate dress as outlined above will be asked to change or sent home. As stated above, the general guidelines of a) clothing needs to cover at minimum the same areas as the school polo or Oxford shirt (just above the elbow) and the shorts/skirts (just above the knee) and b) clothing must be without logos, images, or words apply always. This is especially true of pop culture, e.g. a Disney T-shirt or Cookie Monster pajama pants.

Students are encouraged to wear attire on theme of a music genre, i.e. jeans, flannels, and cowboy boots for country music, sequins and bright colors for pop music, black and leather for rock music, etc. Be creative! Students may emulate a famous musician as long as the general guidelines are followed.

Wednesday: 2/12/25 College Gear

Students are encouraged to wear a T-shirt or sweatshirt representing a college. Students may also wear accessories that correspond with a college, such as socks or hats.

Students are encouraged to wear Spirit Wear T-shirts if they do not possess any college wear. Students not adhering to College or Spirit Wear must wear the uniform shirt.






SENIOR CAP AND GOWN

PREP POLICIES

FOOD DELIVERY POLICY

Food Delivery Policy

Students are not permitted to order food to campus. If you (the parent/guardian) are ordering food for your child, please ensure it is sent to the Prep office and arrives at the appropriate lunch time:

Students will not be allowed to walk to the Archway office to pick up food deliveries and will not be allowed to eat their lunch outside of those times. As a reminder, school breakfast and lunch is provided every day free of charge. Students should take advantage of the breakfast and lunch options provided or be prepared in bringing their own food from home or from a store/restaurant prior to school hours.

ATHLETIC DEFICIENCY POLICY

Athletics:

Athletics are an important part of the overall educational program at Maryvale Preparatory Academy. Participation in athletics is a privilege available to all eligible students.

Ineligibility is defined as having a grade below 60% (F) overall in one or more classes at the eligibility check.

Eligibility will be checked every week each quarter on the first day of the week, as well as from the quarterly report card (Q1, Q2, Q3).

Ineligibility will last for the week (or until the next grade check), regardless of grade changes midweek.

Grade updates will be given weekly for all student-athletes and coaches to track their progress.

After-School Homework Club:

Each week any student with an F in the homework category for any class will be placed in the Homework Club by the Dean of Academics. Homework Club is strongly recommended to help students increase their homework which in turn affects all other aspects of their academic life. Homework Club is offered on full-days 3:00-3:30pm.

OFFICE HOURS/ TUTORING

Our morning Office Hours and Lyceum Tutoring programs offer students opportunities to receive additional support from their teachers to help them succeed in class. Students may work with their teachers during optional Morning Office Hours from 7:25 – 7:50, while teachers select and invite particular students to work in small groups during mandatory Lyceum Tutoring from 2:25 – 3:00 on full days. Teachers will communicate the days that they have Office Hours and Tutoring to their students. We encourage all of our students to take the initiative to drop in during Morning Office Hours and require them to attend Lyceum Tutoring so that they can be successful at Maryvale Prep!

CELL PHONES AND PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY

As stated in our Handbook, the use of cell/smart phones, and smart watches during the school day is prohibited. The reason for such a prohibition is to promote an uninterrupted academic environment. Maryvale Prep has a compelling interest in keeping students not just by physically present on campus, but mentally and emotionally present as well, and the ways in which we use of phones and social media encourage detachment from real persons and conversations are a commonplace.

- A student should keep a cell phone turned off (not merely silenced, but off) and
- cell phones must be stored in their locker during the school day. Cell phones may not
- be brought in pockets or purses into classrooms.
- Cell phone use is permitted on campus after school and only in the school office area or
- outside the building.
- If a student needs to phone a parent/guardian during the school day, the student must come to the school
 office to use one of the school phones. If parents/guardians need to get an emergency message to a
 student before the end of the school day, they should call the schools main telephone line and ask for a
 message to be delivered.
- Violation of the above restrictions will result in confiscation of the cell phone and disciplinary action. Cell phones will be turned in to the school office and released only to parents/guardians after confiscation.

STUDENT PARKING

Any student driving and parking on campus must provide **License and proof of Insurance** NO EXCEPTIONS. Maryvale Prep offers our Prep Student Drivers the opportunity to purchase a year long reserved parking spot for the 23-24 School Year. SCHOOL UNIFORMS

Students must be in full uniform every day, if shirts have not been purchased yet or online orders have not arrived, they can come in solid navy or solid green polos and khaki bottoms. All shoes must be solid black, brown, or white. All backpacks must be one color scheme/solid colors and no pop culture.

Middle School (7th & 8th)- navy or solid green polos and khaki bottoms or Maryvale Prep Skirt. **High School-** white or light blue Oxford/ Polos (Only Available at Anton) Khaki bottoms or Maryvale prep Skirt.

Please refer to the **handbook** for allowed uniform components and our **website** for authorized uniform vendors.

DETENTION POLICY

Detentions are earned for many reasons, some examples are excessive tardies, chewing gum, phone use, etc. Detentions are served the same day, a detention is earned, from 3:05-3:35. Detention only occurs on a full day, so if a detention is issued on an early release day, then the student will serve it the next full day. If a student does not attend detention, then an additional detention is incurred for skipping detention. Athletes must serve a detention before attending practices or games.

PREP GATE CLOSURE TIMES

East entrance gate will close from 1:00p.m.-2:30p.m. on full todays and from 11:00 a.m.-12:15 p.m. on Half days, Any parent wanting to pick up their students between these times will have to park in the north parking lot by entrance and walk through student entrance gate to get to prep office. You will not be able to pick up or drop off your prep student in Archway Office. We will not call students out of class until parent is present. When picking up students please give yourself enough time for pickup, as students are sometimes transitioning classes and can take longer to arrive to office for pick up.

STUDENT WALKERS

Our student walker dismissal area has moved.

Prep walkers will be dismissed at 1:00 pm on early release days and 3:00 pm on full days.

On full days, Prep students can wait for their Archway siblings until they are released at 3:20 pm and they can head out to Gate 4 to walk home or meet families together.

On Early Release Days, Archway students can wait for their Prep siblings until they are released at 1:00 pm and they can head out to Gate 4 to walk home or meet families together.


All 1st through 12th grade students not waiting for siblings as noted, must exit campus immediately. All students will walk along the sidewalk adjacent to the Marley Center and out Gate 4 and should meet their parents in the suggested area noted above. Please refrain from walking through Gate 4 onto campus or crowding up that area to ensure the flow of traffic continues and students do not get lost amongst waiting families. The only parents who should wait near Gate 4 in an ordered line fashion along the fence/wall are Kindergarten parents.

Please note that signing your child up as a walker is a liability you are taking as they are not supervised or delivered directly to parents. We ask that as parents, you calculate the best option for your family as you consider safety and convenience.

For the first few days of school we will have more staff aiding the direction of this new release area and of students/families new to walking but soon thereafter, we will not continue this supervision and hand off.

Student walkers will be allowed to take their phones out to connect with parents/guardians once they have exited Gates 6 and 7.

SCHOOL POLICIES

ATTENDANCE

A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused.

This year, we are introducing **CUTS LITE Service** (Court Unified Truancy Suppression Limited Intervention To Educate). We will follow the following timeline:

- 5 Absences: You will receive the 1st warning letter CUTS Lite Conference
- 9-11 Absences: 2nd warning letter CUTS Hearing
- Parent Conference/School Intervention





TARDIES

Any student here beyond 7:57 a.m. is considered tardy and **must be signed in by a parent in the front office.** If you are in carline during the 7:57 a.m. cut off time, you will be asked to drop off student at the Front Office. Please avoid any consequences for multiple tardies by arriving on time. **3 tardies = 1 absence**

PICK UP

Due to our school day in sessions and safety precautions arrival for end of day pick up will not begin until 2:30 pm. If you arrive prior to that, please note that you will be asked to exit campus and return after 2:30 pm. Emergency and office business vehicles cannot get onto campus if the school is blocked with waiters.

- Enter into the carline until after 2:30pm on Full Days and after 12:15pm on Early Release Days. This will allow our students & faculty to have a cleared parking lot in the event EMS needs access.
- Please keep the *East Entrance merge point cleared* at all times. Wait to enter until all traffic is cleared.
- Archway & Prep: follow blue/green signs and snake through faculty parking lot
- **Prep only:** follow blue/green signs, snake through faculty parking lot & merge out of lane by Prep building
- Maintain safe parking lot speed of 5 mph
- Merge point will utilize a zipper merge (1 car per lane)

EARLY STUDENT PICK UP

Students who need to be picked up early for appointments must be picked up in the main office **no later than 2:45pm on full days and 12:30pm on half days, NO EXCEPTIONS.** The current Placard with student's name or a valid identification with photo is required when picking up through the office. The student must be signed out with a reason for leaving. **3 early pick ups = 1 absence.**

LATE PICK UP

Any student who is picked up after 3:45 pm, will incur late pick up fees beginning with the second occurrence of late pick-up, families will be assessed a late pick-up fee according to the following fee schedule:

- Up until 4:00 p.m. = \$5.00 per student
- 4:01 p.m. 4:30 p.m. = \$5.00 per student + \$1.00 per student, per minute
- After 4:30 p.m. = same fee structure as above + Department of Child Safety phone call

PLACARD FOR CAR-LINE PICK UP

Placards can be accessed on the Parent Portal at https://greathearts.schoolaxis.com/

Log in, on main page PICK UP PLACARDS, Select Maryvale Prep Academy, Download and Print, if you cannot locate the placard on your Parent Portal Account, please contact the Front Office. Please note, we will not accept phone images of the placard for student pick up, parents must have the current paper copy of the placard for safety and fast process.

STUDENT WALKERS

If you would like to add your child to the walker list, you will need to do so at least **12 hours in advance** of when you want them to begin walking. If you do not receive confirmation, they have not been added and will have to wait until then to be dismissed as walkers. Please note, once on the walker list they must walk daily until they are removed. If you want your child to be on the walker list, please email **enrollment@maryvaleprep.org**. The same applies if you want them removed.

Students must leave campus immediately; the gate opens at 3:00pm and after 3:30pm there is no supervision. All students will be released from campus liability by 3:30pm and will be outside of perimeter gates. Please meet your student's at the gate on time. Students cannot stay and wait for athletes during practices and/or games.

CAMPUS SAFETY

Our campus has 5 security gates. East Entrance gate includes a vehicular gate and a pedestrian gate. The plastic yellow chain by the south Prep corner has been replaced with a locking vehicular gate and the west side exit is now secured with a vehicular gate and a pedestrian gate.

Students are allowed onto campus at 7am and all of these gates will be opened at this time.

Student walkers should adjust their time on campus to reflect the timing of the campus gate openings.

RED FIRE LANE

Please do not park in the red fire lane are next to the stop sign. Cars will be towed at your own expense.

SCHOOL ZONE

We have school zone signs posted and are in the works for additional modifications from the City of Glendale to make school zone safety more prominent.
