

1. We have some clothing items available to loan for the day, please speak with **Dr. Huemer,** or **Ms. Vaughn.**


2. Seniors can wear their senior photo attire all day (shoes should be solid color and safe for walking on campus all day) or change into regular uniform.

ENRICHMENT COURSES

Speech (and Debate*) - Mr. Butler

Mondays & Thursdays, 3:05-4:15 p.m.

7th-12th grade

This course is designed in conjunction with Ms. Hill's high school equivalent (Storytelling). Students will compete in a variety of topics in teams of one or two, learn how to memorize passages, generate and present ideas, develop public speaking skills, and throughout the process, strengthen overall English comprehension skills. Students will practice their chosen topic(s) and will compete at multiple speech meets throughout the year.

2.Art-Drawing Studio-Mr. Canisales

Tuesdays, 3:05-3:45 p.m.

7-12th grade

Students will have an opportunity to expand on and hone their drawing skills. Members will have conversations on how to improve their individual art. Students will be able to compare new artwork to old artwork to see their progression and produce completed projects.

3.Art & Writer's Workshop - Zines Collaging Club - Ms. Trujillo

Thursdays, 3:45-4:30 p.m.

7-12th grade

Creating "Zines" can be a creative way to summarize a certain topic of interest or study like a short brochure or mini book. Students may incorporate current topics they are discussing in their main school subjects into their Zines to create an interactive/personalized study guide for their academic needs. Student' must recall what they are currently learning/discussing in their classes weekly in order for the Zines to be helpful study tools. They have creative freedom with choosing Zine composition/class content but must include clear information, pictures, and/or aids that will contribute to a creative study tool!

4.Book Club - Mr. Echeverria

Mondays, 3:05-3:45 p.m.

7-12th grade

Students will read books outside of regular school-day curriculum. Students will read and seminar together.

5.Engineering-LEGO Building-Ms. Maring

Tuesdays, 3:05-3:45 p.m.

7-12th grade

Students will get hands-on motor skill practice and instruction following practice. This is a skill that is necessary for any student looking to go into a trade or a detail oriented profession. Students will be allowed to have a final creative project in LEGO Engineering. This is where they will take the skills of following instructions, fine motor skills, and creativity to create whatever they choose, and they must also provide some sort of instructions on how to create/re-create their masterpiece.

6.Instrumental Music - String Instruments Club - Mr. Turner

Tuesdays, 3:05-4:00 p.m.

7-12th grade

This club will focus on learning the basics of string instruments where the students have the choice of Violin, Viola, or Cello. This will help students learn music, apply it to their instrument and have them focus on creating a beautiful sound. Students will play for the teacher and with each other to assess their progress. PLEASE NOTE: Students will need to BUY or RENT an instrument in order to participate in this club.

7.Robotics - Mr. Butler

Tuesdays, 3:05-4:00 p.m.

7-12th grade

Robotics Club is a team-oriented competitive club in which students work together to build a robot throughout the year and program it to compete in events against teams from other clubs through AZ First Tech Challenge.

8. Strategic Games - Checkers - Mr. Ward

Mondays, 3:05-3:45 p.m.

7-12th grade

This course emphasizes analyzing game mechanics, anticipating opponents' moves, and devising adaptive strategies. Games are designed to enhance working memory and sustained attention through repeated pattern recognition and scenario planning. This enrichment course will sharpen students' critical thinking and decision-making skills through engaging gameplay, transforming abstract strategy into practical problem-solving abilities applicable across academics and life.

9. Honors Choir - Mrs. Rand-Lowe

Fridays, 3:05-4:00 p.m.

9-12th grade

Experience the joy of singing in harmony and sharing the work in creating beautiful, challenging music. This is an advanced choir for committed students that are ready to focus on singing three-part harmony music. Students will learn several pieces this semester to perform in the Winter Arts Showcase program. Additionally, students will work together to build skills and participate in the full day Great Hearts Honor Choir Festival, singing with schools all across the valley in the Spring.

10.Culinary Arts - Cooking & Baking - Mrs. Myers

Tuesdays, 3:05-3:45 p.m.

9-12th grade

This club will focus on teaching students responsibility and creativity. Students will have the opportunity to choose recipes each week, bring in their ingredients, and then make the food. We will enjoy the food together and have a time of fellowship between grade levels in a leisurely setting. Each meal will be the deliverable used to evaluate student performance. If it is edible and delicious, they will have succeeded.

11.Writer's Workshop - Storytelling - Ms. Hill

Mondays, 3:05-3:45 p.m.

9-12th grade

Students will enhance their logic and organizational skills by writing stories and practicing public speaking when presenting their creative work. Students will present their respective stories at the end of the semester to group members/audience.

Student Leadership Options - FREE - DURING SCHOOL HOURS

12. Student Council - Mr. Mendez & Ms. Wolpert

Students interested in joining Student Council, which collaborates with school leadership in the coordination of events like dances and spirit weeks, should express their interest to Mr. Mendez. This group is free and only open to high schoolers, who will be represented on Student Council by representatives (2 per grade level), a vice-president (12th grade only), and a president (12th grade only). In addition to planning events, Student Council members also have important opportunities to mentor younger students, host guests at our school, and lead in other ways. Student Council elections for high schoolers will take place on September 25th.

13. Photography Society - Ms. Vaughn / Dr. Huemer

photography will allow students to learn more about photography and take pictures at spirit weeks, pep rallies, and athletic events to contribute to the yearbook and social media. Photography is open to all grade levels and will meet regularly with Dr. Huemer / Ms. Vaughn to schedule individuals at events and recap photography experiences.

14. Yearbook Design - Ms. Vaughn

Yearbook designers will learn about the elements of graphic design and create a keepsake for the student body for years to come! The design team will be limited to 6 high-school students who must interview with Ms. Vaughn.
