A MESSAGE FROM ARCHWAY HEADMASTER

Hello Maryvale Prep Families,



It was so great to see so many of you at our Family Partnership event yesterday. With 69% in attendance, we are pleased with our turnout. Our teachers have been working hard for weeks and staying late into the evenings in some grade levels to prepare resources for your children to use at home. We hope that the night was fruitful for you and that you are better equipped to partner alongside us as we ensure your child's academic success. We want to push for 100% attendance at these events and encourage you to mark your calendars for the next one on February 11th and to encourage others to attend. With just four weeks left of the quarter, we hope to partner closely alongside you to finish out our first academically strong. In addition to academics, we believe greatly in every aspect of human flourishing and want to continue engaging in the role moral formation plays at school. As always, we ask for your partnership in guiding students in the virtues by reinforcing the same habits that encourage friendship, kindness and responsibility. As we have moved into the year and friendships are forming, we are also finding that we are having to guide behaviors and kindness much more. One thing we encourage you to talk about with your students at home is the story of Socrates and the Three Sieve (https://mot.global/2020/05/the-story-of-socrates-and-the-three-sieves/)s. This story is something we can apply to our lives and encourage our students to do as well. It is important to guide our children to ask themselves whether a story, action, or comment is true, kind, and necessary before passing it on. 3RD-6TH GRADEBOOK

Every Monday grades will be updated in the <u>parent portal</u> for 3rd-6th grades. You may have noticed in the Parent Portal that it currently shows an "F" or failing grade for special area courses. Please know that your child is not failing. This is simply a technical issue with how the system displays grades. At this point in the term, specialists are required to enter an "IP" (In Progress) mark, which the system unfortunately reads as a 0% or "F." This is only a placeholder and does not reflect your child's effort, performance, or standing in class unless you specifically receive a deficiency notice from your child's specialist.

DEFICIENCY NOTICES

You will continue to receive deficiency notices if your child drops into that category prior to the end of the grading period. Please continue to reach out to your child's teacher to identify ways to support progress for your child.

ENROLLMENT

We still have openings for most grade levels, with offers likely to be granted immediately in Kinder- 2nd grade. Please share this with your family and friends. We have had more outreach from within the community about openings and are happy to spread the word and serve more students if possible.

DRESS CODE REMINDER

Please be sure to review our uniform and dress code policy on pages 40-42 of our Archway Family Handbook. Our faculty and staff are doing their best to log any dress code infractions which you should be receiving. A few things we are noticing are hair accessories, jewelry, lunchboxes, <a href="water bottles, backpacks, keychains etc. <a href="with pop culture/cartoon characters. Personal items should be void of these. Students will be able to choose one keychain to keep on their backpack which helps with identification for some, but this should not be in the form of a stuffed animal (e.g. Labubu's, Squishmallows or larger than finger sized). Please be sure to examine what your child is bringing to school and make adjustments.

Additionally, it has come to our network left nails out of our handbook this year. Students will be allowed to wear nail polish but their nails must be of natural length to ensure safety and hygiene. Nails should **be void of raised/3D embellishments and pop culture**. Should a student become distracted with their nails/polish, they will receive a dress code referral. Artificial nails are not recommended for Archway students, but should you choose to allow it for your child, please ensure the length is natural.

Dress Code

Dresses

- Dresses may not be strapless.
- Dresses may be backless.
- Dresses may not show midriff.
- Dresses may not have a slit that exceeds mid-thigh.
- Dresses may not be cut below the bust line.
- Dresses cannot have cuts or slits in them exposing skin underneath.
- Undergarments should not be visible. See-through apparel is not permitted.
- Dress or skirt length must reach at least the student's fingertips.
- Dresses may not be overly form-fitting.

Other

- Suits are acceptable attire.
- Jeans may be worn.
- Appropriate shoes for dancing should be considered.

Any one out of dress code will not be permitted entry.

Maryvale Preparatory Academy Spirit Week Attire Guidelines Fall: September 22nd-26th, 2025

General Guidelines for ALL Days:

- Students must be in Spirit Week attire or the school uniform each day.
 Clothing needs to cover at least the same areas as the school polo or oxford (just above the elbow) and the shorts/skirts (just above the knee) and contain no rips or openings.
 - 3. Clothing must be without logos, words, or pop culture references (except where noted).



Monday, 9/22: Country vs. Rock 'n' Roll

1. Students are encouraged to emulate either a country music/star or rockstar, i.e. flannel, cowboy hats, boots, denim or black, jeans, studs, etc.

ALLOWED Non-ripped jeans, sneakers, boots

NOT ALLOWED Hoodies, ripped jeans, pop culture, shorts, tank tops, leggings, sweatpants, revealing clothing, wigs

Tuesday, 9/23: Class Colors Day

- 1. Students are encouraged to wear attire of their assigned class color.
 - a. 7th Grade Orange
 - b. 8th Grade Purple
 - c. 9th Grade Green
 - d. 10th Grade Pink
 - e. 11th Grade Red
 - f. 12th Grade Blue
- 2. Students may wear pants, shorts, shoes, socks, hair accessories, jewelry, etc. of their class color. If not adhering to class color, attire must be uniform.

ALLOWED Non-ripped jeans, sneakers, Crocs (class color only), class color accessories NOT ALLOWED Hoodies, ripped jeans, pop culture, shorts, tank tops, leggings, sweatpants, revealing clothing,

Wednesday, 9/24: Literary & Historic Figure Day

- 1. Students are encouraged to dress as their favorite literary or historic figure from the Great Hearts K-12 curriculum, i.e. Plato, Frog & Toad, Frida Kahlo, Frederick Douglass, Frankenstein's monster, etc.
- 2. Attire must be "school appropriate" and not contain pop culture references or comprise anything immodest. Use good judgement for what will be a comfortable and safe costume and will cover all the same parts of the body as the regular school uniform. Students out of compliance will be asked to change or sent home.
- 3. Props such as hats are permitted, props such as a sword are not.

Thursday, 9/25: Spirit Wear & MVP Spirit Day

1. Students are encouraged to wear MVP Spirit Wear, navy and maroon colors, and show Matador pirit. MVP athletes may wear their team jerseys.
