UPCOMING ARCHWAY FIELD TRIPS

We are moving into field trip season and wanted to share the dates so you can begin planning ahead. As we get closer, teachers will share more details and reach out about chaperone opportunities. In order to be considered as a chaperone you will need to have clearance through Raptor before the field trip. Raptor clearance must be renewed annually, if you were cleared last year, you must complete the clearance process again for the **2025-26** school year. VIRTUE OF THE MONTH

January is Courage Month in our calendar of Virtues. Courage is the virtue of showing strength in the face of fear or difficulty. This month, we will talk about historical figures who exemplified moral courage. Here is our first historical figure we will be highlighting: Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

During the Civil Rights Movement, Dr. King chose the difficult path of nonviolent resistance in the face of unjust laws, hatred, and violence. He endured imprisonment, constant threats, and physical danger, yet refused to respond with anger or revenge. While jailed in Birmingham, Alabama, he wrote Letter from Birmingham Jail, explaining that injustice must be confronted directly and that waiting for change often means allowing injustice to continue. Dr. King's courage was rooted in his deep Christian faith and his belief that every person is made in the image of God. He spoke boldly against segregation even when many urged him to remain silent or moderate his message. Rather than seeking personal safety or popularity, he accepted personal sacrifice for the sake of justice and peace. Dr. King believed that courageous action guided by love could transform both oppressors and the oppressed. His leadership helped bring about lasting change through the Civil Rights Act and Voting Rights Act. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s life reminds us that true courage is not driven by hatred or fear, but by a steadfast commitment to truth, justice, and love.

STAFF HIGHLIGHT

Mr. Butler serves as the 7th grade Music Theory teacher and 9th grade Poetry teacher at Maryvale Prep, providing students a foundational knowledge and appreciation for the arts. He is also the lead coach of the school's new Robotics team.



Mr. Butler grew up in Southern Indiana. After graduating from high school, Mr. Butler attended Baylor University in Waco, TX, where he majored in History and minored in Political Science. While there, he participated in Model Organization of American States, a program focused on political dialogue and diplomacy in the Americas, for all four years of college. After college, he returned to Indiana before moving to Arizona in 2024. He previously taught at Great Hearts Christos in Gilbert before joining Maryvale Prep this year.

Mr. Butler has a strong passion for Music, and has played piano for over 16 years. As such, he believes in the importance of maintaining excellence while enabling students to engage with and find joy in the material. Mr. Butler says, "I am lucky to have found Maryvale Prep and to be a part of a unique and thriving school culture. I appreciate the students' willingness to learn and attempt difficult things in class, and they have proven time and time again that can take on new things and succeed with the right guidance and effort. I love seeing the progression in both ability and in mindset that students have from the start of the semester to the end, and having students come back and ask to keep being in class."

When not teaching, Mr. Butler enjoys reading history books, travelling, exploring National Parks, writing and producing music, and spending time with family and friends.

GALILEO TESTING

Galileo testing is quickly approaching! The Galileo assessment is a valuable tool that helps us understand your scholars' progress and make informed decisions to support their academic growth.

Here are some essential details and tips to help your child prepare for the upcoming Galileo Testing:

Testing Dates:

- Galileo Testing will take place on **Wednesday, January 21.**

Test Preparation:

- Encourage your scholar to review class notes and materials to reinforce their learning.
- Ensure they have a quiet and well-lit space for studying and homework.
- Be supportive and provide a positive environment for their preparation.

Test-Day Essentials:

- On test days, please ensure that your scholar arrives at school on time.
- Make sure they get a good night's sleep and have a nutritious breakfast.

The Parent Portal allows you to see all missing assignments, homework, participation, and test/quizzes grades and any comments teachers have made. The gradebooks are updated by **Monday morning at 8:00 a.m.** Mid-quarter, Quarter, and Semester reports will continue to go out each quarter. OUTERWEAR POLICY
