UPCOMING ARCHWAY FIELD TRIPS

We are moving into field trip season and wanted to share the dates so you can begin planning ahead. As we get closer, teachers will share more details and reach out about chaperone opportunities. In order to be considered as a chaperone you will need to have clearance through Raptor before the field trip. Raptor clearance must be renewed annually, if you were cleared last year, you must complete the clearance process again for the **2025-26** school year. The cost is \$6 and it only takes a few minutes. [Click here](#) to start the process. Field trips have a fee to help cover transportation and venue fees. Payment and electronic permission slip must be completed by parent/guardian in **Configio**. Payment can be processed two weeks ahead, the notify me feature can send you a reminder. Please make sure you select the correct participant for the field trip and their grade. If selected as a field trip chaperone, you need to have clearance through Raptor before the field trip.

DEFICIENCY NOTICES



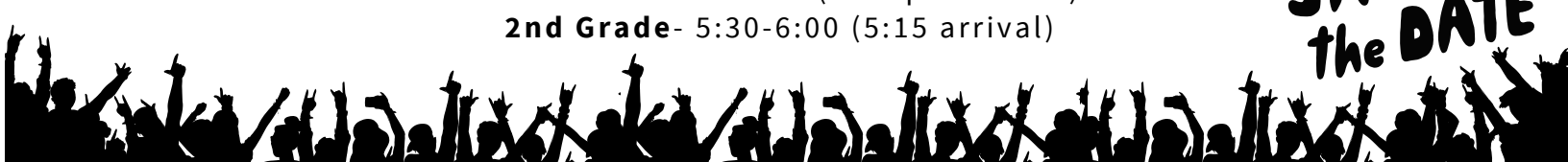

DRESS CODE REMINDER

The student uniform is an essential part of our identity. It unifies our community of learners, reflects our shared pursuit of the true, the good, and the beautiful, and minimizes distractions of fad and fashion. By doing so, the uniform supports our students' intellectual and moral development, reminding us that true individuality is formed in the heart and mind—not in appearance.

Bottoms:

- Khaki dress slacks or shorts with black or brown dress belt.
- Girls may wear school plaid or solid skirts (from vendor).
- Skirts and shorts shall be no shorter than just above the knee.

Footwear:

- Shoes must be solid black or white. Athletic shoes or dress shoes are permitted.
- Socks must be solid black or white.
- Girls may wear solid black or white knee highs or tights with skirts.

Accessories:

- All accessories must be free of pop-culture, political messages, and/o inappropriate messages.
- One necklace, one pair of small earrings, one ring, one bracelet, and one simple watch are allowed. Smartwatches and facial piercings are not allowed.
- Headwear and sunglasses may not be worn inside the school buildings.

Hygiene and personal care:

- Hair must be a naturally occurring color and clean, styled, and out of the face. Neatly groomed facial hair is permitted.
- Hair accessories should be small and match the uniform.

VIRTUE OF THE MONTH

February is Friendship month in our Maryvale Prep calendar of virtues. Friendship is the virtue of loving your neighbor as yourself. As C.S. Lewis explains in *The Abolition of Man*, across all of history and throughout all of time, a basic law has been recognized by all people. It has gone by many names, though the most familiar to most of us is probably the "Golden Rule:" treat others as you would wish to be treated. Here are just some examples of the ways in which philosophers have articulated this most fundamental expectation of virtuous human friendship:

"Never impose on others what you would not choose for yourself." – Confucius

"The sage has no interest of his own, but takes the interests of the people as his own. He is kind to the kind; he is also kind to the unkind: for Virtue is kind. He is faithful to the faithful; he is also faithful to the unfaithful: for Virtue is faithful" – Tao Te Ching

"Men were brought into existence for the sake of men that they might do one another good" – Cicero

Great Hearts scholars show the virtue of Friendship by helping a classmate organize their locker, by holding the door for the person behind them, by keeping one another on time and on focus in class, or by being happy to play with anyone during fellowship. They can show friendship by helping one another pursue what is good, not what is easy. For example, scholars should refuse to let their friends copy their homework or other work. Instead, offer tutoring and support. All scholars are expected to show friendship to others at all times.

Kindness, generosity, seeking after what is good for those around us, and treating one another with respect permeate the culture of our classrooms and our school.

12TH GRADE CPR TRAINING

In compliance with ARS 15-718.01, The Great Hearts network will provide CPR training for all 12th grade students at our Great Hearts Arizona Academies.



Maryvale Prep will hold our CPR training on **Wednesday, February 4**, in the Marley Center.

Roslyn Phillips, our nurse who is certified in CPR training, will conduct the training during regular school hours- **8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.**

Students will complete pre-work together and then learn how to perform CPR. At the end of the training, each Senior will receive a CPR card that is valid for two years.

Maryvale Preparatory Academy Spirit Week Attire Guidelines Winter: **February 9-13, 2026**

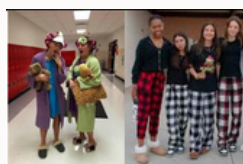
General Guidelines for All Days:

1. Students must be in Spirit Week attire -or- the normal school uniform each day.
2. Themed clothing needs to cover the same areas as the school uniform and contain no rips or openings. Skirts and shorts must touch the knee.
3. Themed clothing must be without pop culture references.
4. **NOT ALLOWED:** ripped jeans, biker/volleyball shorts, leggings/athleisure, kangaroo pouch shirts/sweatshirts, open-toed/backless shoes, too-short or too-tight clothing, pop culture (logos, bands, images, etc).
5. Any themed accessories that are distracting or disruptive to class must be stored in lockers or could be confiscated.

***ANY violation of these guidelines** may result in being sent to the office to call home/change of clothes or being sent home at discretion of the administration.*
